Please join us to show our appreciation and support of our Veterans. This year we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the end of World War I. "The Great War" as it was known at the time- officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars." Students Dane Srsen and Dave Wynkoop will MC this year's program which will include several favorites such as the Presentation of the Flags by Wray Boy Scout Troup #35, Pledge of Allegiance led by WES kindergarten class, several guest and student speakers, and music by the Wray High School Band. Two minutes of silence will be observed at 11:00 am to honor those who have died defending our freedom. Also on display will be memorabilia from several Veterans and special recognition of those who fought in WWI from Yuma County. Local Veteran Organizations will have informational tables. Once again Quilter's Anonymous will give away a handmade quilt to a lucky Veteran.
