The City of Wray Announces Updates on City Services and Programs

The City of Wray commends the manner in which the community members have conducted themselves during the unprecedented COVID-19 event. During these difficult and trying times, it is a privilege to live and work in such a great community. The City has continued to provide the highest level of services during this time.

City department staff have continued to provide unwavering dedication to providing critical services. We are also working hard to develop plans with state and local health officials for the ability to safely increase the availability of services in all city departments.

While many unknowns exist for the coming weeks and months, the City continues to develop plans for programs within the Recreation, Library and Museum departments. Below are up-to-date decisions that have been made in regards to current and upcoming City programs:

- Youth Soccer Pee Wee age 4 to grade K, and City League grades 1-3 and 4-6 are still being considered for later in the summer if restrictions are lifted. In the event the program cannot take place, registered families will be provided vouchers for future programs or reimbursement.
- Youth Baseball and Softball travel programs are being cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions. The City is still considering plans to organize programs that would not require travel to be held with only local participants if restrictions are lifted.
- Youth T-Ball and Coach Pitch Baseball are still being considered for later in the summer if restrictions are lifted.
- Wray Aquatic Center will NOT open on Memorial Day Weekend. The city will evaluate current restrictions and options on June 1 and make a final decision. There has not been a final decision made yet on whether swimming lessons will be held this season.
- All late summer and fall activities (Youth Volleyball and Youth Flag Football) are still scheduled to begin during those times.
- City Parks are open to the public to engage in walking, biking or running activities. All playground and picnic areas are closed to public gatherings. Please be mindful of social distancing requirements.

- Wray Public Library is closed to public access. We are offering contactless curbside services. For requests, please call 332-4744, Monday-Thursday for items and to schedule a pick up time. There has not been a final decision as to when the Library will be open to the public.
- Summer Reading programs will be offered. Plans for programs are being developed in multiple formats and final decisions have not been made.
- Wray Museum is closed to public access but will offer newsletters free upon request, contactless research, genealogy, and local history request can be submitted via email to wraymuseum@cityofwray.org. A final decision on reopening date has not been made at this time.

Please be assured that the City continues to take cautious and prudent steps in response to this event. The City of Wray will continue to monitor the situation, utilize guidance from state and local health departments, and reevaluate as necessary.
